- Human trafficking research has drawn increasing attention since the early 1980s (Wen, Klarin, Goh and Aston (2020) as tolerated sex tourism can facilitate forced prostitution, human trafficking and child prostitution. This workshop will review the key elements of the sex tourism industry using key case studies (e.g. Brazil, Cuba and Thailand) to reinforce student learning and the interrelated relationship between human trafficking and sex tourism will be explored.
