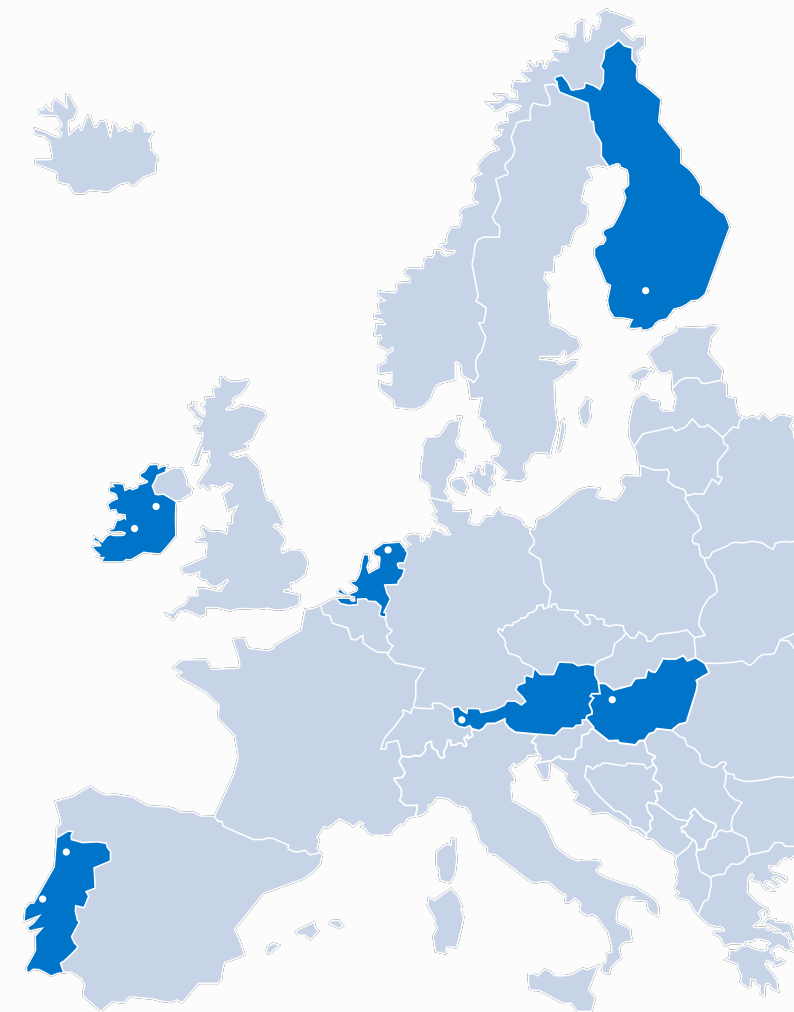

SAP PLATFORM

SAP Platform functions will be described along with the upcoming slides.

Each described workflow is related to different phases of the SAP's platform functions.

The **Workflow I** is the preparatory part of the SAP and it is linked with the first access of the SAP coordinators to the platform, as soon as the Conformity Check is finalized.

Workflow II refers to settling in and adding to the platform, the detailed information of the SAP, starting with the selection of the participating and ending with the certification of the SAP.

WORKFLOW I

- I. The **Opportunities Survey**, the partner search and the elaboration of the **List of SAPs Critical Information Elements** are a pre-condition and are developed outside the information system. This phase is related with the development of the SAP and is not needed the access to the platform.
- II. Once the **Conformity Check** is done (without any condition), the SAP, including some basic characterisation information, is created by the administration of the system. The characterisation data will be:
 1. Title, description, duration, partners, dates, area, typology ...
 2. System Permissions are given to the SAPs coordinators / SAP Joint Coordinating Team (SAPc).

WORKFLOW II

III. The SAPc will complete the missing information and start to introduce the SAP to the platform, and will follow the phases:

1. Module definition (dates, full description, dates), required pre-reading, academic recognition, teaching and learning strategies, etc. (All the information that is found in the List of Critical Information Elements).
2. Assigning one or more teachers to each module;
3. Information for the Transcript of Records (ToR);
4. Assessment Methodology and Grading scale definition (Pass/Fail, grade 0-20, etc)
5. Upload Communication Materials (PDF Programme, poster and social media posts)

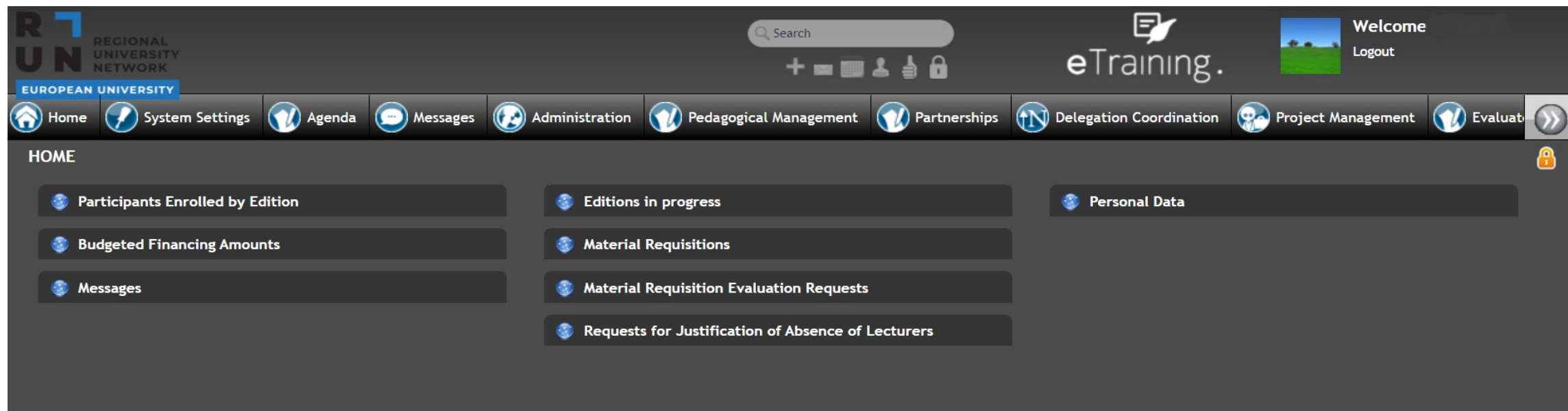
VII. Notification of the selected candidates

VIII. Each selected candidate accesses the platform and confirm interest in participating in the SAP;

IX. Participant will have access to the SAP via Platform;

X. At the of the SAP the student will have the possibility to download his certificate, transcript of records;
