SAP OVERVIEW

The Social and Solidarity Economy (SSE) addresses contemporary challenges without relying on commercial companies or the state. Its significance has grown since the 21st century, culminating in a UN resolution in April 2023 promoting SSE for Sustainable Development. This recognises SSE's role in achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and urges member states to incorporate SSE into education. SSE encompasses diverse community-focused entities like renewable energy communities, time banks, and cooperatively organised local supply, extending beyond conventional market and state frameworks. This SAP aims to raise awareness of SSE's potential in Europe, providing an overview of its actors, activities, principles, and values. The course guides students in understanding informal SSE initiatives and offers initial guidance on developing a community enterprise, including practical tasks and an excursion for firsthand insight into their development.
